(Vienna University of Economics and Business)



Founded by Emperor Franz Josef as the *Imperial Export Academy*, located in Vienna's Palais *Festetics* Becomes *University of World Trade* (Währinger Park)
 Degree programs include Global Trade, Business Administration, Economics, and Business Education




